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Pulitzer Prize-Nominated Composer, Carter Pann, Featured in Residency at Indiana University of Pennsylvania

Indiana University of Pennsylvania Department of Music and Flute New Music Consortium co-host a contemporary music residency featuring composers Carter Pann and Bekah Simms March 2 - 3, 2018. All events (full schedule detailed below) are free and open to the public except where noted.

Composer/pianist Carter Pann has written for—and worked alongside—musicians from around the world, including performances by the London Symphony and City of Birmingham Symphony, the Tchaikovsky Symphony in Moscow, radio symphonies around Europe, the Seattle Symphony, and the National Repertory Orchestra. Awards include a Charles Ives Fellowship, a Masterprize seat in London and five ASCAP awards. Pann was a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize in Music in 2016 and currently serves on the faculty of University of Colorado.

Therese Wacker is professor of Music at Indiana University of Pennsylvania and a flutist with the Keystone Chamber Players and the Keystone Winds.

Bekah Simms is a Toronto-based composer and educator who was recently named by CBC as one of Canada's hot 30 classical musicians under 30 and the winner of the 2017 Toronto Emerging Composer Award. Her works have been presented at the Toronto Symphony Orchestra's New Creations Festival, the Royal Conservatory of Music's 21C Festival, and New Adventures in Sound Art's Sound Travels Festival of Sound Art, among others.

The Flute New Music Consortium was formed in 2013 by flutists for the purpose of continuing to expand the flute repertoire. Members live around the country and world and perform newly commissioned pieces and outstanding works from FNMCs's composition competition in individual recitals, as well as FNMC organized events at regional and national flute festivals. This is the group's second residency, focused on featuring their most recent large-scale commission, Pann's *Giantess* for flute and piano, which will be premiered by IUP Professor of Flute Dr. Therese Wacker and Carter Pann on piano. FNMC has also commissioned an electroacoustic work for flute and mixed media by Bekah Simms, and it will receive its world premiere four times by

up-and-coming professional flutists during the final round of the Flute Artist competition held in conjunction with the residency.
